1 OVERVIEW

- 1.1 The 2009 World Archery Championships will be contested in Ulsan, Korea between the 1st & 10th September. Nations may enter teams of three archers of each gender in each bow division.

2 OBJECTIVE

- 2.1 Recurve selection will be based on sending the best possible team to represent Australia with the objective of winning medals in line with Archery Australia's commitment to the Australian Sports Commission in meeting key performance indicators for benchmark events

3 PRINCIPLES

- 3.1 The following principles have guided the development of this selection policy and underpin any subjectivity exercised in completing the selection of a team to meet the stated objective.
- 3.1.1 Archers should have demonstrated an ability to achieve world class standards in the FITA round and matchplay.
- 3.1.2 Archers should demonstrate the ability to maintain that world class standard over the qualifying period and in less than ideal conditions.
- 3.1.3 Archers must have demonstrated an ability to work harmoniously with other prospective team members, understanding the processes and compromises necessary to maximise the team's performance.

4 ELIGIBILITY

- 4.1 Only athletes that fulfil the requirements of [FITA rule 2.4.1](#) are eligible for selection to represent Australia.

5 QUALIFYING & REGISTRATION

- 5.1 As an initial point of reference, archers wishing to contest selection trials for the 2009 WAC's must have shot an 'A' or 'B' Qualifying score in a registered QRE or tournament at least twice during the period 24 January – 31 December 2008 inclusive to qualify for inclusion in the selection process.

- 5.2 In order to formalise registration, archers must have achieved the minimum standards (above) and have lodged the official registration form (Attachment C) with the ceo@archery.org.au (HPM - fax 02 9772 2749) by COB on 31 December 2008 (including signature and parental consent where appropriate) and paid the \$50 registration fee.
- 5.3 Failure to comply with the above conditions may result in the archer being deemed ineligible to participate in the Selection process and subsequently ineligible for selection to the team

Number of Triallists

- 5.4 There will be no limit to the number of registrations accepted to contest the first selection event subject to each registrant having fulfilled the qualifying criteria and registered in accordance with other clauses in Section 5.

6 SELECTION EVENTS - ADMINISTRATION

- 6.1 The recurve team will be selected from three events. They are;

- 6.2 Each of the selection events will be based on a combination of ranking round and matchplay. Archers will receive points for their final placing in each competition format (ranking round and matchplay). Scores will also be aggregated.

Expenses

- 6.3 Athletes that have shot an A Qualifier are guaranteed an invitation to all selection trials at Archery Australia expense (subject to finishing the first selection trial amongst the eight highest ranked registrants). Archers with a B Qualifier may be invited to contest the selection trials at the discretion of the NHC & Selection Committee. Travel and accommodation costs for the first trial will be at the B Qualifying athlete's expense.
- 6.4 Travel, accommodation and meal costs for the duration of the 2nd and 3rd Selection Trials will be met by Archery Australia for participating athletes.
- 6.5 Following team selection, all expenses for entry, travel and accommodation associated with lead up events, training camps and the 2009 World Archery Championships will be met by Archery Australia for the duration of these activities.

Expenses - Accommodation

- 6.6 Athletes attending the first selection event at Archery Australia expense will be accommodated at the AIS for the duration of the event. If funded triallists choose to utilise accommodation other than that organised by Archery Australia at any selection event they will be subsidised the equivalent amount of the accommodation expense that would otherwise have been incurred by Archery Australia for that athlete only and for the duration of the event only. Local athletes (within 50km radius) will not have accommodation provided or be paid any accommodation costs
- 6.7 The HPM will arrange accommodation at Archery Australia preferred premises on behalf of unfunded athletes at the athletes request. Any other arrangements and transfers to and from venues are the responsibility of the athlete.
- 6.8 All requests or variations from athletes are to be advised a minimum of six weeks prior to the commencement of each event. Changes will only be accommodated in exceptional circumstances.

Expenses - Travel

- 6.9 Athletes from outside the area of each trial will be flown to the appropriate city for each event. In the event that athletes choose to drive they will be compensated \$100 each way plus the cost of fuel upon presentation of receipts. Local athletes (defined in 6.6 above) will not be paid travelling allowance.
- 6.10 All travel preferences are to be advised to the HPM a minimum of six weeks prior to the commencement of each event. Changes will only be accommodated in exceptional circumstances.

7 SELECTION EVENTS - OPERATIONS

Management Responsibilities

- 7.1 Where a selection event is not part of a larger event, i.e. it doesn't form part of an event being conducted by a third party, Archery Australia will appoint an Event Manager to oversee the operation of that trial. The Event Manager will be responsible for all aspects of the Selection Trial and ensuring that it is conducted in accordance with these instructions and FITA rules and will be the liaison to the CEO for any issues.

Program

- 7.2 The Trial program will generally conform to the following

Conduct

- 7.3 Archery Australia will facilitate the appointment of a sufficient number of appropriately qualified judges and officials to oversee each trial. Trials will be conducted in accordance with FITA rules including the count back of 10's and X's to determine ranking round placings when no archer will be eliminated.
- 7.4 On completion of the first selection event, only the eight highest ranked triallists (relative to each other) will remain eligible to contest the second and third trials.
- 7.5 Where practical, the Event Organiser/Manager will endeavour to provide a practice field.

Ranking Round

- 7.6 The ranking round for each trial will be a full FITA round.

Matchplay – Third Party Organisation

- 7.7 Matchplay will be conducted in accordance with the Event Organiser's program.

Matchplay – Selection Specific Event

- 7.8 If the trial is being conducted specifically for the purpose of selection to the 2009 World Archery Championships, i.e. not in conjunction with another event, matchplay will be conducted as follows
- 7.8.1 All archers will shoot each round of matchplay.
- 7.8.2 All matches will be shot in 4 x 3 arrow ends.
- 7.8.3 Archers will shoot alternately with 30 seconds each arrow.
- 7.8.4 Ranking for the first match of each such trial will be determined from the ranking round.
- 7.8.5 Ranking for subsequent series' of matches will be determined by placing in the immediately preceding series.

Matchplay - Byes

- 7.9 Should an archer have an individual bye they will be required to shoot that match and have their score recorded (in order to have shot an equivalent number of matches to all other athletes for the purpose of accumulating score)
- 7.10 In the event that one gender has a full bye, e.g. the women's matchplay begins at the ½ round and the men begin at the ¼ rounds, there will be no requirement to shoot the bye. The Event Manager will be responsible for determining commencement and completion of the shorter series. Irrespective, practice on unused competition targets will not be permitted outside designated practice times.

Point Allocation

- 7.11 Table 1 indicates points to be allocated to athletes based on their placing in each of the ranking rounds. Only the top eight ranked athletes will receive points.

- 7.12 Table 2 indicates points to be allocated to athletes based on their final placing relative to other triallists in each matchplay element. Where several matchplay series are shot, each match will attract the points indicated in Table 2 and a simple aggregate of these will determine the overall placing for the matchplay element of that trial. Those placings will then attract the points indicated in Table 2 for accrual in the selection process.

Trial Ranking

- 7.13 The ranking round and matchplay placing points will be aggregated on completion of each selection trial and the simple total will determine the triallists rankings relative to each other. Ties will not be separated unless archers are equally placed on completion of the Selection Trial series (para 9.2 refers).

First Selection Trial

- 7.14 The first trial will be conducted in conjunction with Canberra Archery Club's 'Australia Day' tournament in January 2009. The format for this tournament will include at least one FITA round and a modified matchplay process (similar to Attachment A). Points will be awarded in accordance with tables 1 & 2 above and the number of trialling athletes will be reduced to the top eight ranked archers of each gender on completion of the trial.

Second Selection Trial

- 7.15 The second trial will be conducted in conjunction with the Archery Australia International which will utilise a FITA round for ranking followed by a modified matchplay. Triallists may be entered as members of the National Team, AIS Team, a 'Pro' team or as individuals. Placing points will again be allocated based on performances in the ranking round and individual matchplay relative to other registrants. Athlete's that are included in teams are expected to continue shooting with their teams no matter their individual outcomes. Archery Australia will provide accommodation, transfers and entries to this tournament.

OR

- 7.16 Will be shot at the Australian Institute of Sport in accordance with paragraph 7.2. Archery Australia will provide a detailed program in due course.

Third Selection Trial

7.17 The second trial will be conducted in conjunction with the Archery Australia International which will utilise a FITA round for ranking followed by a modified matchplay. Triallists may be entered as members of the National Team, AIS Team, a 'Pro' team or as individuals. Placing points will again be allocated based on performances in the ranking round and individual matchplay relative to other registrants. Athlete's that are included in teams are expected to continue shooting with their teams no matter their individual outcomes. Archery Australia will provide accommodation, transfers and entries to this tournament.

OR

7.18 Will be shot at the Australian Institute of Sport in accordance with paragraph 7.2. Archery Australia will provide a detailed program in due course.

8 AUTOMATIC SELECTION

- 8.1 Archers that shoot two scores of 1350 (FITA Round only) or higher within the qualifying period will be selected to the team.
- 8.2 The NHC will maintain his subjective nomination of the third team member of each gender (para 9.3 refers) to the Selection Committee unless all positions are filled prior to commencement of the first Selection Trial.
- 8.3 If more than three archers qualify for automatic selection, Archery Australia will send the top four of those archers (based on the highest average of submitted scores) to the 2nd and 3rd World Cup events. A further selection process & criteria will be developed to select the team of that gender if required.
- 8.4 Should all positions be filled in accordance with para 8.1, no selection trials will be conducted for that or both genders as the case may be. In such event AA will endeavour to provide an additional competition opportunity for selected athletes in lieu of the Selection Trials.

9 FINAL SELECTION

- 9.1 The simple aggregate of placing points accrued in each of the Selection Trials will determine the ranking of archers on completion of the selection process. The highest ranked archers of each gender will be recommended to the Board for selection to positions not already filled or subject to the NHC's recommendation (para 9.3).
- 9.2 In the event that archers have accrued equal points over the course of the selection trial series, their aggregated score for all elements of the series' will determine the higher ranked archer. Should they remain tied, a single arrow shoot off will determine rankings.
- 9.3 Based on his observation of the triallists, the National Head Coach (NHC) may recommend an archer of each gender to the Selection Committee to fill the third position in each team. In nominating a third team member the NHC will take into account but not be limited by the following considerations;
 - Results and reports recorded from collated data and information including recent competitions, Archery Australia ranking list, sports science and sports medicine tests or considerations and ability to maintain required training loads/programs.
 - Past national and international performances.
 - The athlete's current level of skill and physical fitness.
 - Any injury or condition which may have or will impair, inhibit or prevent the athlete's performance.
 - Prevailing conditions in relation to trialling and results.
 - Factors relevant to team combination, particularly team balance and harmony.
 - Adherence to Archery Australia policies.
 - In relation to other performances considered by the NHC, relevant weather conditions, medical conditions or equipment breakages or malfunctions may be considered in determining the importance and relevance to be accorded to performances.

10 WITHDRAWAL

- 10.1 If, at any point in the trial process, an archer withdraws, the result of all matches the athlete has shot to that point will stand.

Accident, illness or other circumstance beyond the control of the athlete

- 10.2 An athlete may only be excused from fully completing the 2009 World Target Championship Selection Trials where;
- 10.2.1 The athlete either;
- 10.2.1.1 Is ranked in the top 150 in the FITA International Ranking List current at the date of commencement of the relevant trial; or
- 10.2.1.2 Has represented Australia as a member of an official Archery Australia Target Team and has placed 16th or higher in the final placings at the 2008 Olympic Games or FITA World Cup Event in the twelve months prior to the date of commencement of the relevant Selection Trial; and
- 10.2.2 The Selection Committee and NHC are satisfied, on the basis of available evidence, that the athlete's inability to fully complete the Selection Trials is due to an accident, illness or other circumstance beyond the reasonable control of the athlete.

Application to Selection Committee

- 10.3 When an application is made to the Selection Committee to excuse an athlete from fully completing the Selection Trials, the provisions below shall apply.
- 10.4 When an archer is unable to participate or continue in a Selection Trial due to an incident, illness or other condition beyond the control of the archer concerned the following conditions apply.
- 10.4.1 Unless the archer concerned is either –
- o ranked in the top 150 on the FITA International Ranking list current at the start of the Selection Trial; or
 - o ranked in the top 8 in the latest National Ranking List or
 - o has represented Australia in the 12 months prior to the date of the start of the Selection Trial concerned and has been placed 16th or higher;
- that archer shall be deemed to have abandoned the Selection Trial.
- 10.4.2 If an athlete concerned meets the requirements of condition i above, that person must notify the CEO as soon as possible and provide medical or other evidence to support their claim.
- 10.4.3 The Selection Committee shall determine as soon as possible whether the athlete concerned shall be readmitted to continue with the selection process.
- 10.4.4 If the Selection Committee determines that the archer concerned shall not be permitted to proceed with the selection process they shall advise the archer of their decision in writing. The Board will determine any appeal of the Selection Committee's decision.
- 10.4.5 Where the Selection Committee determines that the archer concerned shall be permitted to continue with the Selection Process the archer will be permitted to compete in any subsequent Selection Trial.
- 10.4.6 If the archer's withdrawal was prior to or during the 1st Selection Trial, the person must shoot in the single FITA round of the 2nd Selection Trial and be placed within the top 8 of the archers competing.
- 10.4.7 If the archer concerned does place within the top 8 of the 1st Selection Trial single FITA round, the archer in last place (9th place) shall be eliminated from further competition.
- 10.4.8 If the archer withdraws prior to or during the 2nd Selection Trial the archer may compete in the 3rd Selection Trial following approval by the Selection Committee. The archer will commence the 3rd Selection Trial with the Ranking Points obtained in the 1st Selection Trial only.
- 10.4.9 If an archer cannot compete in the 3rd Selection Trial due to illness or injury or other condition beyond the archer's control, the archer will be ineligible to compete further in the selection process.

10.4.10 In order to assist with considerations any applications made by an archer the Selection Committee or the Board may request the archer obtain further evidence or undergo further medical examination by a doctor nominated by the Board.

11 2009 PROGRAM

11.1 T present, the program for 2009 will be based around the competition guide provided in the Archery Australia 2009 International Competition Guide (Open) at Attachment C.

11.2 The HPM will ensure all selected athletes informed of programming changes and developments post selection.

I, the above participant, nominate for consideration by AA for selection to the National Team for the title event. I acknowledge and agree that:

1. I have access to and will be bound by and observe the terms of the 2009 World Archery Championships Selection Policy (Recurve), the Event Supplement and AA Policies.
2. I will also be bound by and observe the terms of the policies and requirements of the Event Organiser/s of the Selections Events and of the event for which I seek selection.
3. The 2009 World Archery Championships Selection Policy (Recurve) and AA Policies may be amended by AA from time to time. I will observe those policies as amended and acknowledge that any amendments to those policies will be posted to the AA website (www.archery.org.au) along with any other policies and requirements applicable to the title event for which I seek selection.
4. The decision whether or not to accept my nomination, and if accepted to select me in the National Team for the title event in which I seek to compete, is subject to the eligibility requirements, the criteria set out in the 2009 World Archery Championships Selection Policy (Recurve), the Event Supplement, and is at the discretion of AA and the Selection Committee under the terms of that policy and supplement. I acknowledge that I have satisfied and will continue to satisfy the eligibility requirements and agree to inform AA in the event that I no longer satisfy any of the eligibility requirements.
5. I acknowledge that AA will require me to sign an Athlete Agreement as a prerequisite to nomination.
6. My contact details are legibly set out in the Athlete Agreement
7. I will notify AA in writing of any change to the contact details provided in the Athlete Agreement. Any failure by me to advise AA in writing of a change in my contact details may be to my detriment. Any announcement to be made or notice required to be sent pursuant to the 2009 World Archery Championships Selection Policy (Recurve) or Event Supplement will be deemed to have been made or announced on the day of publication on the AA website or otherwise on the next day following publication on the AA website. AA may deliver a notification or announcement to me by sending the notification or announcement to one or more of the contacts listed in the Athlete Agreement or such other contact as notified in writing by me, and will be taken to be duly made or given to me:
 - a. In the case of delivery by post, three days after the date of posting (if posted to an address in Australia) or seven days after the date posting (if posted to an overseas address).
 - b. In the case of facsimile transmission, the next day after the date of its transmission.
 - c. In the case of e-mail, the next day after the date of transmission unless AA is advised that the transmission failed to send to me; and
 - d. In the case of delivery in person, when delivered.
8. I acknowledge that I should check the AA website on a regular basis during the process of selection for inclusion in the National Team to check for announcements and notifications, in addition to those sent to me by mail, e-mail or facsimile. I acknowledge that AA may also send an SMS message to me advising that information has been posted to the AA website and/or sent to me at one or more of the contacts listed in the Athlete Agreement
9. By signing this form I give my consent for disclosure of Medical and Personal information to, but not limited by, Team Management, Selection Committee, Event Organisers, International Federation, media outlets and anti doping agencies.
10. I acknowledge the following:
 - a. The Selection Committee and NHC have the power to engage experts, including medical or health professionals to provide reports or conduct examinations of the Participants, with further authority to provide such reports and information to AA solely for the purpose of considering selection to or removal from a National Team or Squad and for that purpose for monitoring the performance and attitude of any such member or Participant.

- b. When selecting members of the National Team from the Participants the Selection Committee can take into account the results recorded from collated data and information including past results, sports science or medical tests or considerations, training camp performances and ability to maintain required training loads.
11. I agree to train in designated training locations and in accordance with designated training programs and to travel to required international competitions for the required durations as directed by AA.
12. I acknowledge that if I wish to compete in the 2009 World Archery Championships I must sign and return this AA 2009 World Archery Championships Nomination Form (Recurve) to be eligible for selection.
13. I acknowledge and agree that;
- a. I am required to comply with the requirements of any commercial arrangements (including, without limitation, sponsorships, endorsements, appearance or similar commercial arrangements) entered into by AA for the benefit of AA and I consent to the use by AA in print, digital and electronic media, of photographic, sound and video images of me, my image, my likeness and my name for the purpose of promoting AA;
 - b. On or before signing the AA 2009 World Archery Championships Nomination Form (Recurve), I am required to fully disclose in writing to the CEO, details of any existing Commercial Arrangements to which I am a party, including details of the other parties and any provisions that may conflict with Commercial Arrangements entered into by AA for the benefit of AA;
 - c. In the event that the terms of any Commercial Arrangements to which I am a party are inconsistent with and conflict with my obligation to comply with the requirements of any Commercial Arrangements entered into by AA for the benefit of AA, my obligation to comply with the requirements of any Commercial Arrangements entered into by AA for the benefit of AA will take precedence;
 - d. I will not enter into any Commercial Arrangements or public relations, media or promotional activities without the prior consent of the CEO, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld when it does not in the CEO's view interfere or adversely affect my obligation to comply with the requirements of any Commercial Arrangement entered into by AA for the benefit of AA; and

 - i. Prejudice the name, reputation or image of AA;
 - ii. Bring AA into disrepute; or
 - iii. Be prejudicial to the interests of AA.
